New Turkish Customs Requirement

Effective 1 January 2013, due to the new Turkish Commercial Law, all FCL & LCL import shipments into Turkey must bear the following clause under the freight & charges column of all house bill of ladings and through bill of ladings:

"Local charges at port of discharge (THC, FREEOUT, ISPS, ENS, D/O, TEMPORARY ADMISSION, LCL SERVICE, DEMMURAGE, STORAGE FEE IF ANY, etc.) are for consignee's account."

Transshipment cargoes to Gemlik or Antalya etc., must also bear the following additional clause on the bill of ladings:

"Customs formalities has to be done at port of entry."

If cargo is place on hold by the US customs authorities, the whole consolidation container will be affected.



Global trade data reveals extent of demand dearth in second half

Global container trade volumes contracted 5.49 per cent year on year in October to 10.46 million TEU, according to the latest data published by Container Trade Statistics (CTS).

The news comes as demand across the globe continues to disappoint and carriers appear to be divided over whether to lay capacity up or not. Certainly some lines are, many others are not, however.

Some of the largest falls in demand in October actually occurred in the emerging markets, which many had been pinning their hopes on this year to help offset the slide in trade to the developed world.



The latest slide in total world volumes marks the fifth straight month of contracts in container shipping, which means that of the months that we have data for this year; the split between growth and contraction months is even.

Smart money is certainly on two more months of contractions in November and December, which will put the balance in favor of contractions. If we look at the individual markets there is also very little to cheer about.

Asian exports, a key indicator for the health of world trade, were down 5.34 per cent from the same time last year for the month to 3.62 million TEU. This also represents a slide of 6.84 per cent month on month from September.

Imports fared little better dipping 3.38 per cent year on year to 1.87 million TEU. It was, however, an improvement on September's 1.73 million TEU.

In Asia's leading export markets of Europe and North America import volumes were also down.


