





Diminishing Demand Evokes Oversupply Fears for 2011

THE peak season this year seems to be shorter than usual. Although container volumes in 2010 are expected to exceed last year's level, growth is now beginning to slow.

With US unemployment hovering around 10 per cent and the EU debt crisis looming as a formidable storm cloud, the global growth of demand, after reaching a pinnacle in the first half of the year, is losing momentum.

Cargo is expected to show little growth for the rest of the year. Alphaliner's weekly report states that decreasing demand in the second half will bring the global throughput growth to about 12 per cent for 2010, while the demand growth forecast for 2011 is expected to further decline to between six and eight per cent.



This indicates a downward trend in the second half and next year, where supply is projected to grow substantially, as demand begins to temper off. Freight rate levels, which continue to hold at profitable levels, are forecast to come under increasing pressure in the months to come.

Further expansion of slow steaming, which has helped reduce the supply surplus so far this year, will be limited in 2011, according to Alphaliner, because most carriers have already adopted the practice.

Statistics from other sources also reveal that oversupply may return in 2011 because the strong recovery in major economies has been tapering off since the third quarter.

According to a recent HSBC Global Research report, cited in the Hong Kong Shipping Gazette, container traffic will grow 12 per cent this year, but only six per cent in 2011.

The bank's researchers also forecast that the average growth in freight rates will be at 17 per cent this year, but only two per cent next year. It added that in the first half 2010, the global volume of containers handled grew by 15 per cent; however, sea freight is expected to grow only 12 per cent this year.

Clarkson reported that 32 containerships or 198,000 TEU in capacity was ordered in the month of July alone. According to the Shanghai Shipping Exchange (SSE), these orders were a direct response by the liner community to the strong demand witnessed in the first half.
